Discussions and Decisions taken:

- At the outset, Prof. Sumangala Damodaran, Dean, SDS welcomed all the members and invitees for the meeting of the Board of Studies and explained that the Board is meeting after a long period of about three years. During this period, it was explained that the School had proceeded further in its various endeavours, especially in terms of offering academic programmes such as MA (Development Studies) and Ph D (Development Studies). While some of the earlier faculty members are not with the school now, in the recent past a few more faculty members joined the school and right now, SDS has eight faculty members. It was added that, with this changed profile of the school, the present meeting of Board of Studies assumes special importance. Prof. Damodaran also briefly explained the role and mandated Board Studies and informed Board's recommendation/approval is required before the School takes up its academic proposals to statutory bodies of the University, such as SCAP and Academic Council.
- As the first agenda item, the Minutes of BOS meeting held on 6th May, 2014 were approved, subsequent to a brief reporting of follow up actions on the decisions of the previous meeting of Board of Studies.
- At the outset, prior to deliberating on other agenda items, Prof. Sumangala Damodaran, Dean, SDS explained that in 2018, AUD is going to complete 10 years of its existence and at this juncture, it will be good to initiate a committee to have a comprehensive evaluation of the School's activities, during its first decade. It was observed that this sort of an assessment will be of immense use to identify the strengths, weakness and potential of the school and to have a clear road map for future activities. This will also equip the school with necessary preparations and inputs for a possible evaluation that the AUD may be taking for the University as a whole. The members unanimously welcomed and agreed on this idea and had a detailed deliberation on this matter. Subsequently, the Board of Studies entrusted Dean, SDS to further take up this matter, by constituting a committee and to entrust the committee with specific terms of reference and to come out with a detailed assessment report, within a stipulated time period. The utility of having at least one external member was highlighted by some of the members. Prof. Ashwani Saith was requested to be one of the members of the Committee.
- Subsequently, the members had generic discussions on the broad structure of the MA programme offered by SDS. The clarifications sought by members regarding the programme include: What has been the pattern of preferences of the students, while selecting the electives, and how it has been changing over the years? Where are they placed for internship? What are the norms followed in the school for allowing the students to choose electives

offered from other Schools? After detailed deliberations, it was agreed unanimously that the school can consider introducing a cap in re selection of elective courses from outside the School (e.g. 8 credits compulsory from the SDS's courses). At the same time, it was observed that, it not desirable to restrict the choice of students beyond this stipulated credit. They can be allowed to choose according to their individual preferences. Some of the members also pointed out that it is better to have a review of some of the electives offered by other schools and then to come out with a list of 'approved' or 'suggested' electives from outside SDS. This will help the students in identifying appropriate electives which are also related to Development Studies. Some of the members also suggested the school to consider the possibility of introducing some of the electives in the first year of MA programme, but after having a detailed discussion and planning in this matter. It was unanimously agreed by all the members that though the school can have a detailed list of approved elective courses, all these may not be offered to the students in a particular semester/year. Depending upon the availability of faculty members and their specialisation, at the beginning of each semester the school can notify as to which are the electives available in the particular semester. Detailed discussions were also held on various other aspects teaching, evaluation and the compulsory course on internship. In the light of these, it was suggested that all these matters can be reviewed based on the experience of the school in the previous years, while carrying out the Assessment of School's activities.

- After detailed deliberations the Board approved the elective course on a course 'Gender and Development'. While approving the matter, the Board also suggested that School can also have a review of gender related courses offered in other schools, primarily to avoid possible overlaps.
- The outline of an elective course that SDS has been offering (tiled, 'India in World Affairs')
 was briefly discussed and the majority of Board members felt that the course need to be
 properly reworked, incorporating many other relevant matters, which are not at present
 included in the course contents. It was suggested to place the revised course structure in a
 subsequent meeting of the Board.
- The Board of Studies also approved the newly proposed elective course titled Political Economy of Development: South Asia in a Comparative Frame'. While discussing this matter, the members unanimously observed that introducing such a course will be a good addition to the extant course structure of MA (Development Programme). It will be ideal to keep this course as one which is not 'India-centric'. Also, it will be good to design the contents of this course on certain identified themes, which are taught in a comparative perspective.
- The Board also approved the elective course titled 'Prejudice and Politics: Perception and Manifestation'. During the deliberations, some of the members also pointed out that since

the theme of the course is a universal one, it is necessary to expand its focus beyond India. Thus, the School was advised to bring in a comparative analysis for this course.

- The board also considered the proposal on the course titled 'Development and Security'. But after detailed deliberations, it was suggested that approving this course can be deferred as the present outline requires some revision. Accordingly, the school was directed to re-work on the proposal and to bring the revised proposal for the approval of the Board in a subsequent meeting.
- Though the Board discussed briefly about some of the issues related to MA dissertations and certain matters related to attendance, it was suggested that these matters can be included in the evaluation process of the school, which will be initiated shortly.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the members and invitees.

Discussions and Decisions taken:

- Minutes of BOS meeting held on 22nd February, 2013 were approved. It was shared with the members present that as par the BOS recommendation, SDS has reduced the number of core courses. Semester 3 and 4 of MA are entirely dependent on electives. On the recommendation for drawing up clusters based on theme of courses offered, SDS faculty is proposing to open possible clusters of specialisation in Development Economics, Peace, Conflict and Development, Industrialisation, Urbanisation and Labour and Gender and Development.
- Discussions among the members present opened up for the logic behind offering
 courses in the form of clusters. SDS faculty discussed that the idea of clusters is to
 allow different study and research components within Development Studies to
 thrive.As students move from internship phase to dissertation, clusters can bringsome
 level of integration of students' area of interest and facultys' area of interest, primarily
 based on the current expertise.
- Members recommended that clusters should be more than just a set of courses. It should be able to achieve more than that is not offered at present. It could be a qualifier to a different degree. Students will be given specialization benefit of the

cluster in which they pursue courses. They must be given option between opting for cluster courses or take up courses that may not be within one specialization area. They should be given guidance to choose the pathway.

- Both sides of approach to be taken in consideration while designing structure of cluster courses, it must address broader theoretical base and bring in the applications/ practice part wherever possible. The logistics, skill issues, its connectivity with Research Methods and collaborative efforts with programme/faculty from across AUD schools has to be worked out.
- The School should begin with a few clusters. Development Economics, Peace, Conflict and Development and Industrialisation, Urbanisation and Labour were approved. Health economics and ecology economics are possible areas where courses be offered within Development Economics. Further thought was needed on courses that may be designed within Gender and Development to offer it as a form of cluster.
- List of experts for Selection Committee was endorsed. Experts from the field of
 political science were also to be included in the list. Prof. Zoya Hasan, Prof.Ujjwal
 Singh and Prof. SudhaPai were recommended for the list.
